Summary:

Haydon Angel Jewel has played in all the major tournaments in the world, winning the Argentine Triple Crown, the US Gold Cup three times, the British Open Gold Cup twice, The Queen's Cup, the Coronation Cup and the Spanish Triple Crown twice. Owned by the world's best player Adolfo Cambiaso he rated her "as his best horse to play outside Argentina".

She won Best Playing Pony awards in the Coronation Cup, US Gold Cup, US Open, Spanish Silver Cup and runner-up in British Open Gold Cup.



Played by the world's best player 10 goaler Adolfo Cambiaso to win the Test Match for Argentina against England. He played Haydon Angel Jewel in the fifth chukka, scoring a run away goal from the lineout to start the chukka at the centre of the ground. From the preceding lineout immediately he took the ball again going all the way, this time on the near side, hitting the ball in the air, while heavily marked. The trophy was presented by HRH The Prince of Wales.



- In the 2010 English high goal season she was played by Adolfo Cambiaso in the Dubai team to win the double, both the Queens Cup and the British Open Gold Cup.

Adolfo Cambiaso changed her name to Mia Gatita and played her in at least two chukkas in the matches during the high goal season. In the final of the Gold Cup he played her in three different chukkas to claim the title. Angel Jewel was judged Runner up BPP.

- Polo Times acclaimed Haydon Angel Jewel as the “world’s number one player Adolfo Cambiaso’s best UK mare” in a profile in August 2010 edition.
- Haydon Angel Jewel performances in the UK have been recognised by featuring twice on the cover of the ASHS Journal.



- In 2014 she returned to England after playing in America and Argentina to win the British Gold Cup at Cowdray Park with the Dubai team for a second time.
- It was then onto Spain in 2014 with the Valiante team and they did not lose a game to win the Spanish Triple Crown played at Sotogrande. They won the Bronze, Silver and Gold Cups.
- In the Silver Cup final Haydon Angel Jewel won BPP.

- In 2015 she was played by 10 goaler Pablo MacDonough in the final of the Queen's Cup replacing an injured Adolfo Cambiaso, losing in extra time. She then played in the semi-final of the 2015 British Gold Cup.
- It was onto Spain again in 2015 where she played the Silver and Gold Cups, winning them both again for a second time.



Achievements in America:

- In the America Haydon Angel Jewel played in 26 Goal Triple Crown series which includes the C.V. Whitney Cup, the USPA Gold Cup and the U.S. Polo Open.
- She won the C V Whitney Cup, the Gold Cup twice and played in the final of the US Open.
- Haydon Angel Jewel was in the winning US Gold Cup team in 2013 and 2012. She won a BPP in the Gold Cup and in the US Open. In 2013 she was in the US Open Best String of Ponies.

- In 2012, the USPA Gold Cup was won by Valiente II 11-9, with Robert Jornayvaz, Pelon Stirling, Adolfo Cambiasso and Alejo Taranco. Haydon Angel Jewel won a BPP as seen here at the presentations.



- In 2013 Valiente again won the Gold Cup. Valiente were then riding an 11-game winning streak going into the final of the US Open where they lost to Zacara. Adolfo Cambiasso won the Best Sting of Ponies which included Haydon Angel Jewel, below.



- The photo below shows her running in the winning goal in overtime in Valiente's match against Zorzal when they were locked at 12 goals each. It took just 12 seconds for Adolfo Cambiasso to run in the winning goal on Angel Jewel, below;

- Being the world's best player Adolfo Cambiaso demands incredible things at times from his horses. Other players cannot believe she has maintained her mouth after so many years of playing the top polo around the world. This incredible photo shows him shutting down Haydon Angel Jewel to keep control of the ball in the US Open before going onto score. She has answered his call to the extent that her hocks are on the ground while he maintains a perfect vertical position with his head directly above the ball.



- In 2016 she returned to the US winning the US Gold Cup for a third time before being retired to stud at 15 years of age. Below playing her last game.



Achievements in Argentina 2013:

- Haydon Angel Jewel (Mi Gatita) went from America to win the 2013 **Argentine Triple Crown** with the La Dolfina team. She was played by 10 goaler Pablo MacDonough who was awarded MVP Pro for December 2103 on the World Polo Tour. The all-conquering La Dolfina polo team did not lose a game and were raised to the perfect 40-goal team for 2014.
- **Won Tortugas Open 2013**
- **Won Hurlingham Open 2013**
- **Won Argentine Open 2013**



- Haydon Angel Jewel played in the La Dolfina team which completed the extraordinary feat of winning all three 2013 Argentine Opens, the Triple Crown. It was the first in the team's history and they went through undefeated. In recognition of this achievement, the La Dolfina team had their handicap raised as the only team in the world with the perfect and maximum 40 goals.
- They won the Tortugas Open then the Hurlingham Open followed by the highest rated polo tournament in the world, the Argentine Open. It was played at Palermo "The Cathedral of Polo" in front of sell-out crowds.



- She was played under her Argentine name, Mi Gatita, by 10 goaler Pablo MacDonough, who was recognised as one of the players of the series. His teammates were fellow 10 gaoler's captain Adolfo Cambiaso, Pelon Stirling and Juan Nero.



Haydon Angel Jewel is a ninth generation mare bred at Bloomfield by the Haydon family. She is from the Haydon Jewel Family, one of the best old Bloomfield families which traces back to Countess in 1882 to Bangle (1896), Locket (1907), Necklace (1924), Bracelet (1934), Jewel (1950), Trinket (1967) and to Emerald (1978). She combines the tried and proven bloodlines of Tester, Starlight, Bruce, Gibbergunyah, Pantler and Never Doubt with Midstream (sire of Sundown) and Star Kingdom through Drawn.

Her dam was Champion polo mare Haydon Emerald, who played right up to Test match level when played by 8-goal Australian captain, Jim MacGinley, pictured. She was by the renowned polo sire Haydon Never Doubt by Never In Doubt. Full details of the Jewel Family and Stallions are on the website www.haydonhorsestud. Her sire Haydon Drawn was Australian Champion Three-Year-Old, who broke the track record winning the Rosehill Guineas. He won three group one races.



HAYDON DRAWN was an ability brown thoroughbred stallion standing 15.1 hh. He was a good horse to ride with the added bonus of being one of the best horses of his generation on the track, breaking a track record at Rosehill Racecourse. He was awarded Australian Champion Three-Year-Old in 1986 & to quote: "Rarely has the Australian turf seen such a courageous horse. Drawn was recognised for his class, courage and toughness. He started in 23 stakes races either winning or being placed in 13." A sire with outstanding ability, quality, conformation, progeny and temperament, being easy to ride with only a halter on. By Star Shower from Penny Draw, combining the bloodlines of Midstream (sire of Sundown), Pipe of Peace, Alycidon, Wilkes and Star Kingdom.



He is the sire of a long list of successful horses including; Brisbane Cup winner Smart Alec, the sires Nightwatch, Drawaway in Western Australia & The Kimberley's, the playing stallion Redraw and The Don, Angel Jewel BPP at Coronation Cup 2009 played by the world's best player Adolfo Cambiaso and Argentine Triple Crown winner, Celestial Champion Horse 2007 Scone League, Blush played the Ellerston final in 2005 before playing in England, Madonna Champion Horse 2010 Scone League, Moonlight, Champion Novice Polo Pony in 2000, then played overseas, and runner-up Evette, Champion Polo Pony & all round gelding Dark Draw, Scud played in England for many years, including the final 2010 Gold Cup, Rosecup now playing in WA, Olivia played at Ellerston by 8 goaler Alejandra Mussio before playing in England, Festina Champion Polocrosse horse 2007 Queensland titles, Signature played by Australian polocrosse player Cameron Sheppard, top polocrosse horses Tiffany, Drawlina, Peony Rose & Overdrawn, Fiesta, Bacardi & Casino-winners of many ribbons in the show ring, Lisette top priced filly at National Yearling Sale and second top priced filly Bouquet and numerous other horses including Tourmaline, Angel Jewel's full sister retained as a broodmare, Fleetwood, Treasure Draw, Venus, Rebecca, Posy, Scent, Rugosa, Penny Gift, Penelope, Dream Jewel, Night Draw, Nectar, Tiffany, Moonstruck, Voss, Mist, Lilac, Robina, Bingo, Driftwood, Moonstruck, Dawnlight, Falcon, Destination, Violet, Ruby, Penny Jewel, etc.

JEWEL IN THE CROWN

A highly decorated mare, Australian-bred Haydon Angel Jewel has had a truly amazing international polo career, culminating in a win in the Argentine Open



Excelling at the very top level, Haydon Angel Jewel, or Angel, was foaled in 2001 at Haydon Horse Stud at Blandford in the Upper Hunter Valley – the 'horse capital' of Australia.

The Haydon family has been breeding horses at the New South Wales stud since 1832, producing more than 10 generations of homebred horses. The stud is currently breeding from Angel's full sister, who has produced six fillies, one of which has already played in the Argentine Open, and her two half-sisters.

Current stud owner Peter Haydon counts Angel's dam, Haydon Emerald, as one of the best mares he ever played. She won many prizes and was played at Test level by former Australian captain Jim MacGinley. Angel's sire, Haydon Drawn, a track record holder who has sired a long list of other top-class polo horses, was awarded Australian Champion Three Year Old.

Trained through Haydon Stud's standard programme, starting with young horse chukkas, Angel played the Scone League and at Windsor

in New South Wales before going on to Ellerston, where manager Jim Gilmore recognised her potential. He placed the mare with the great Argentine player, 10-goaler Adolfo Cambiaso, in England for the 2009 season, changing her name to Mi Gatita. After playing her on the Dubai team at the Queen's and Gold Cups, Cambiaso then played her on International Day at the Guards Polo Club, beating England in the Coronation Cup Test Match. After two spectacular runs, the mare was awarded Best

Playing Pony (BPP) in her first-ever season in England, the trophy presented by Peter Haydon's former employer, HRH The Prince of Wales.

In her second season in England, both horse and team were unstoppable and Dubai won the high-goal double – the Queen's Cup and the Gold Cup. Cambiaso often played Angel for at least two chukkas in the matches during the high-goal season. In the final of the Gold Cup, he played her in three different chukkas, on the way to clinching the title. This time, the mare was runner-up for the BPP award.

Angel was then flown to the US in 2011 to be used by Cambiaso in his high-goal campaign with Valiente II during the 26-goal Triple Crown series. As the world's best player, Cambiaso at times places huge demands on his horses – and Angel rarely disappointed, winning both the 26-goal C. V. Whitney Cup and the USPA Gold Cup twice, in 2012 and 2013. She also played twice in the final of the US Open and in 2013 won a BPP and was in Cambiaso's US Open Best String of Ponies.

In one of Valiente's US Open-round matches, against Zorzal, the teams went into overtime after being locked at 12 goals each. With Angel's impressive speed, it took Cambiaso just 12 seconds to run in the winning goal in extra time. Following the US Open, Angel was flown to Argentina to play in the 2013 Triple Crown with La Dolfina. After losing to Ellerstina in the previous year's Open final, La Dolfina left no stone unturned in their determination to regain the title. And all their planning paid off – for the first time in the team's history, they won the first

tournament, the Tortugas Open. They went on to win the Hurlingham Open, culminating in a triumphant win in the final of the Argentine Open, having gone through undefeated after winning the Triple Crown. In recognition of this great achievement, the all-conquering La Dolfina team had their handicap raised and are now the only team in the world to play on 40 goals.

Her win at Palermo, 'the cathedral of polo', in the highest-rated tournament in the world, in front of a sell-out crowd, only adds to Angel's highly international CV. And now Mi Gatita is being brought to England to play with Adolfo Cambiaso. As Pablo MacDonough says of her: 'Mia Gatita is perfect for playing in England at the number 3 position as she is agile and very handy. It is quite something to play for the number 3 player in the British Open as well as in the Argentine Open.'

After playing in four different countries at the very highest level, with the best players in the world, it's true to say, the mare, now 13, has been on an incredible journey.

polo IN THE UK



The Hayden family enjoyed a memorable trip to England in July where HAYDON ANGEL JEWEL followed on from her impressive debut season in 2009 to firmly establish herself as one of the best polo ponies in the country, culminating in being judged Runner Up Champion Horse in the final of the 2010 Gold Cup British Open.

HAYDON ANGEL JEWEL has been an integral part of the legendary Chalon team that has completed the British double winning both the Quakers Cup at the Guards Polo Club and the Gold Cup British Open at Cowdray Park. She was placed in both the second and final Chalon of the Gold Cup to win the crown 14-12 from Victor Vargas's team Lechuzas Casacas.

The mare is played by Argentine 10 goals Adolfo Cambiasso, described now as the best polo player ever, and the current holder of the three major world polo trophies: the Argentine Open, the US Open and now the British Open. Everyone jokes about how he should be re-hashed above the 10 goal maximum to 12 goals!

This year saw 20 top teams competing for the 186, playing four round league games, progressing to quarter and semi-finals culminating in the big final day at Cowdray Park. A huge crowd gathered for the final, with luncheon maniques, over 60 facade stalls and the very evident presence of the main sponsor 'Woolie Dicks'. Long term commentator Terry Hanson entertained the crowd and added to the experience. He continually refers to Angel as Cambiasso's best pony, and singles her out during play telling the crowd to 'watch this pony'. Even he went as far as asking the crowd for a round of applause for 'that pony'.

During the week Adolfo Cambiasso invited Peter, Alison and Nick Whayton to visit the impressive 100 acre farm in Berkshire, where Adolfo showed them his horses and played a few short matches in readiness for the big game ahead. It was very interesting to get all of Angel's details and full breeding, which traces back ten generations at Haydon Horse Stud.

established in 1852 at 'Bloomfield' in the Upper Hunter Valley, New South Wales. When asked what training he did when she arrived, Adolfo replied, 'nothing... she was perfect... I just play her' 'as no legs were bothering'. The doctors are run very professionally and they specialise in judging that fine line in horse preparation throughout such an intensive high level season to ensure their horsepower will be the best on Friday day.

Adolfo plans to take Angel to Argentine next year to play her in the Argentine Open, and will include her in his embryo program over there. Angel's full sister is HAYDON DOURMACHINE, whose first foal HAYDON VICTORIANA has also just been

exported to Argentina and began playing there in February. Interestingly, HAYDON VICTORIANA is by the Haydon Stud sire MURFARBING VICTORY, whose half-sister is also making her mark in the high goal in England playing in the 17 Openers team.

The final foal special significance for the Haydons, as up and coming 8 goaler player Saxon Cabot (just re-hatched) to 10 claim HAYDON SCUD in the opposing team. HAYDON SCUD is by HAYDON DRAWN, sired by the sire of HAYDON ANGEL JEWEL, HAYDON DRAWN was awarded Australian Champion Three Year Old of the year on the trot track, breaking a track record at Rosedale, and winning or placing in 13 some races.

HAYDON NIGHTWATCH's progeny that are coming through suggests he may prove to be a more influential stallion than his sire, with the likes of HAYDON SATELLITE (AUS) being used as a sire in the United States, and HAYDON TARTAN, HAYDON APOLLO, HAYDON RAINDROP and many other talented young horses coming through the ranks.

An interesting innovation at the Gold Cup this year was the use of big television screens, not only to show the replays but also to list the names of the horses each player was playing on at that particular

time. The screen controllers had radio contact with a coordinator from each team who called in as every change of horse was made. Before the final a list of all the horses and their breeding was available, so the spectators could then follow the horses as they played.

In HAYDON ANGEL JEWEL's case she always played the second and last chukka, while HAYDON SCUD was often played in sections of three different chukkas. Spare horses are held at either ends of the field, so a quick changeover can be effected as soon as the horse is getting tired. 🐾

Blandford bred international champion

A Blandford born and bred mare took out top honours at the US Open Polo Championships in Florida last month.

Crowned best playing pony at the elite US Open was just another feather in an already jewel studded cap for the über talented 12-year-old stock horse mare Haydon Angel Jewel bred by Peter and Alison Haydon of Haydon Horse Stud.

This is the mares second season in the US after winning all the major tournaments in the UK since 2009 under the expert guidance of rider and world polo legend, Adolfo Cambiasso of Argentina.

An understandably jubilant Peter Haydon said he was extremely proud of the mare.

"She has now been successful in both England and America at the very top level in both the British and now the US Polo Opens.

"This would have to rate right up there for an achievement by an Australian horse overseas," Mr Haydon said.

Angel Jewel was sired by the stud's champion thoroughbred stallion Haydon Drawn out of a highly accomplished polo mare Haydon Emerald.

International glory for Blandford family

THE highlight for many horse breeders is to win on the international stage and local breeders, Peter and Alison Haydon from Haydon Horse Stud at Blandford recently achieved that dream with eight-year-old Australian Stock Horse mare Haydon Angel Jewel.

Angel Jewel was bred and trained on the Haydon's property and despite this being her first season competing in England, she won Champion Polo Pony at the prestigious Cartier International Day at Guards Polo Club at Windsor in England on July 26.

Adolfo Cambiaso, recognised as the world's best polo 10 goal player, led his Argentine team to victory over England to win the Coronation Cup on Angel Jewel.

Mr Cambiaso accepted the award from HRH Prince Charles, who Peter had previously worked for at Windsor Castle.

Angel Jewel was sired by Australian Champion three-year-old thoroughbred Drawn, who won three group one races, including the Rosehill Guineas over 2000m in record time.

Mr Haydon said this speed has been passed on and is evident by the electric pace she displays on the polo field.

Angel Jewel is a ninth generation bred Haydon mare from one of the best families which traces back mother to daughter to Countess in 1882 to Bangle (1896), Locket (1907), Necklace (1924), Bracelet (1934), Jewel (1950), Trinket (1967) to her dam Emerald born in 1978.

This Jewel family combines the bloodlines of Planet, Tester, St Simon, Starlight, Bruce, Gibbergunyah, Pantler and Never Doubt.

Her mother was also a champion mare who played up to test match level when played by Australian captain Jim MacGinley. The stud has retained her full sister and her three fillies plus two half-sisters.

The Haydon family were original settlers in the Upper Hunter establishing their property Bloomfield in 1832 and have been breeding horses ever since.

Mr Haydon is president of the Scone Polo Club and was this year's Scone and Upper Hunter Horse Festival VIP.

HAYDON ANGEL JEWEL has been an integral part of the juggernaut Dubai team that has completed the British double - winning both the Queens Cup at the Guards Polo Club and the big one, the Gold Cup British Open at Cowdray Park. She was played in both the second and final chukka of the Gold Cup to win the crown 14-12 from Victor Vargas's team Lechuza Caracas. The mare is played by Argentine 10 goaler Adolfo Cambiaso, described now as the best polo player ever, and the current holder of the three major world polo trophies - the Argentine Open, the US Open and now the British Open. Everyone jokes about how he should be re-handicapped above the 10 goal maximum to 12 goals! This year saw 20 top teams competing for the title, playing four round league games, progressing to quarter and semi-finals
