A BRIGHT BAY HORSE,

Of extraordinary Beauty and Symmetry, great Bone and Substance, without White or Blemish, Sixteen Hands full,

Foaled in 1832, bred by Mr. J. Edwards, was got by Patron (Son of Partisan) out of Maid of Kent by Soothsayer (Son of Sorcerer); grandson Harriet by Sir Harry; great-grandson by Dorimant—Musc by Herod—Shepherd's Crab—Miss Meredith by Cade—Little Hartley Mare by Bartlet's Childers—Flying Whig by Williams's Woodstock Arabian—St. Victor Barb—Why-not (Son of the Fenwick Barb)—Royal Mare.

PATRON.

A Chestnut Colt, foaled in 1826, bred by the Marquis of Exeter, was got by Partisan (Son of Walton), dam (Augusta's dam) by Rubens out of Guildford Nan by Guildford, Son of Highflyer—Justice—Parsley by Pot-8-on (Son of Eclipse)—Lady Bolingbroke by Squirrel—Cypron (King Herod's dam) by Blaze (Son of Flying Childers)—Selima by Bethell's Arabian—Græme's Champion—Darley's Arabian—Merlin.

PERFORMANCES OF PATRON.

1829. At the Newmarket Craven Meeting, April 20, PATRON won the Riddlesworth Stakes of 200 sovs. each, h. ft., Abingdon Mile, 14 subscribers, carrying 8st. 7lb., leaving his rider Frank Boyce nothing to do but sit still, beating Mr. Hunter's gr. c. by Gustavus out of Canvas, 8st. 2lb., Duke of Grafton's b. c. Burman, by Partisan out of Minuet, 8st. 7lb., Mr. Wilson's ch. c. Liberal (Brother to Reformer), by Whisker out of Vourneen, 8st. 7lb., and Sir Mark Wood's celebrated mare Lacetta, by Reveller out of Lass, 7st. 13lb.

At the same Meeting, on the 23d, PATRON walked over for the Dinner Stakes of 300 sovs. each, h. ft., Rowley Mile, four subs.

Next day, the Son of Partisan won very easily (rode by F. Boyce) a Sweepstakes of 100 sovs. each, h. ft., for colts, 8st. 5lb., Ditch Mile (6 subs.), beating Lord Wharfedale's b. c. Caller, by Whisker out of Octaviana, and Mr. Scott Stonshewer's ch. c. The Lion, by Tiresias out of Emma (Sister to Master Henry) by Orville.—Four to 1 on PATRON.

At the First Spring Meeting, May 5th, the Two Thousand Guineas Stakes was little more than walked over for by Lord Exeter's PATRON and F. Boyce: Mr. Dilly's

b. c. Kean, by Blacklock, though managed by Chifney, had not a shadow of chance. Ten others, either from fear or prudence, paid forfeit.—Eight to 1 on the winner.

On the 8th, the Newmarket Stakes of 50 sovs. each, h. ft.—colts, 8st. 7lb., fillies, 8st. 2lb.—Ditch Mile (23 subs.), were borne off in splendid style by PATRON (Boyce again), who alone was placed. Mr. Rush's b. c. Oatlands, by Tiresias out of Rhoda; Lord G. H. Cavendish's b. c. Spaniard, by Godolphin out of Espagnolle; Lord Grosvenor's b. c. Ebury, by Master Henry out of Bombasino; Mr. Payne's b. f. Pauline, by Moses out of Quadrille; and the Duke of Rutland's b. c. High Priest by Whalebone, dam (Moses and Rachel's dam) by Gohanna.—Five to 4 on Patron, and 3 to 1 agst Spaniard.

At Ascot Heath, June 16 (rode by Doohery), PATRON won a Sweepstakes of 100 sovs. each, h. ft., Swinley Course (10 subs.), very easily by three lengths, beating Mr. Greville's b. c. Glenfinlas, by Moses out of Syonax; Lord Lowther's ch. c. Verdere, by Tiresias out of Landscap; and Lord Vauxhall's gr. c. Laureolous, by Gustavus out of Laurel Leaf by Stamford. In this race PATRON carried 9st. (7lb. extra, as winner of the Riddlesworth at Newmarket); the others, 8st. 7lb. each.—Seven to 4 on PATRON.
